# Welcome

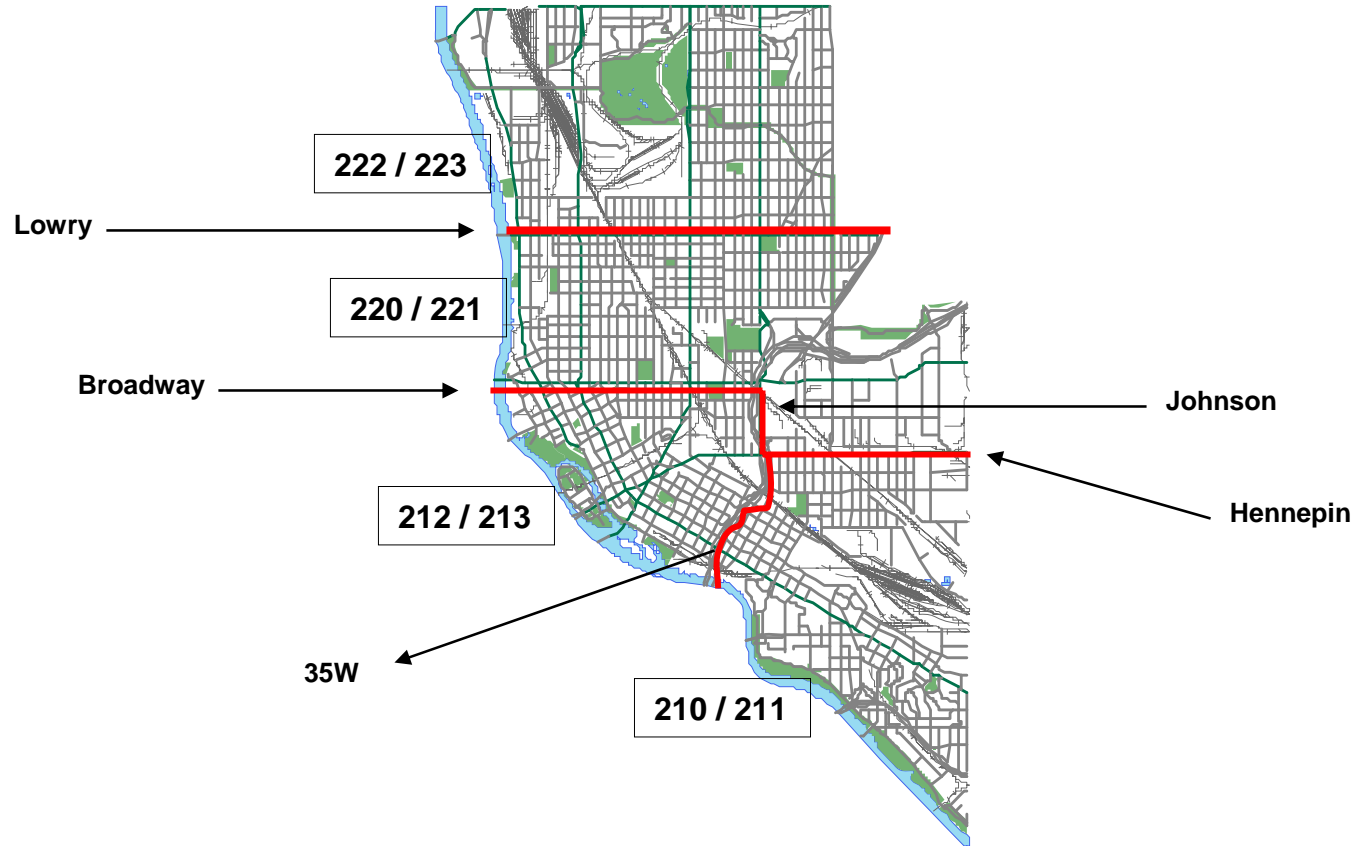
*It is a great honor to present to you the 2009 year-end report . 2009 was a challenging year. We experienced a number of changes both in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Precinct and the Department as a whole. Robert Skomra retired in June after 38 years of service to the MPD, the last 3 of which he served as your Inspector. I was appointed by Chief Dolan on June 15<sup>th</sup> to be your new Pct. Commander. The first order of business was to prepare for the opening of a new U of M Gopher Football Stadium. Its doors opened in September with seven games to follow. Your officers were put to the task in both keeping order and providing a balanced police presence throughout the Precinct on game days. Shortly after coming out of the season, a budget crisis loomed in our City. Not immune from difficult economic times, the MPD faced a large deficit. Layoffs, restructuring, and downsizing was imminent. Fortunately, the Second Precinct was spared. A number of personnel changes took place as well. Lt. Whisney took over Sector 2, Lt. Waite assumed command of Sector 1, and Lt. Reinhardt now commands Investigations/CRT. Through this transition we were able to retain solid, well qualified personnel, not to mention a very diverse one. In fact, approximately 20% of our patrol officers are diverse, mirroring that of our neighborhoods. Last but not least, Council Member Paul Ostrow served his last term as 1<sup>st</sup> Ward Council Member, and was replaced by Council Member Kevin Reich. I commend Paul for his dedication to this community and look forward to working with Kevin in the years to come. Finally, I want to acknowledge my staff and the hard work they put forth in 2009 and you, the community, for all your support, day in and day out, making the Eastside the best place to live in Minneapolis.*

# 2009 Crime Reduction Goals

- Maintain the success of 2008
- Keep burglaries and violent crime down
- Achieve a minimum of a 5% crime reduction in the Precinct.

# 2009 Crime Statistics

- **Part 1 Crime-** (Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Auto Theft, Arson)
  - **Down 8% over 2008**
    - Homicide increased 300% or 3 more than 2008.
    - Auto Theft decreased 28% or 111 fewer than 2008.
- **Violent Crime-** (Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault)
  - **Down 12% over 2008**
    - Homicide increased 300% or 3 more than 2008.
    - Robbery decreased 15% or 20 fewer than 2008.

# 2009 Crime Statistics Cont'd

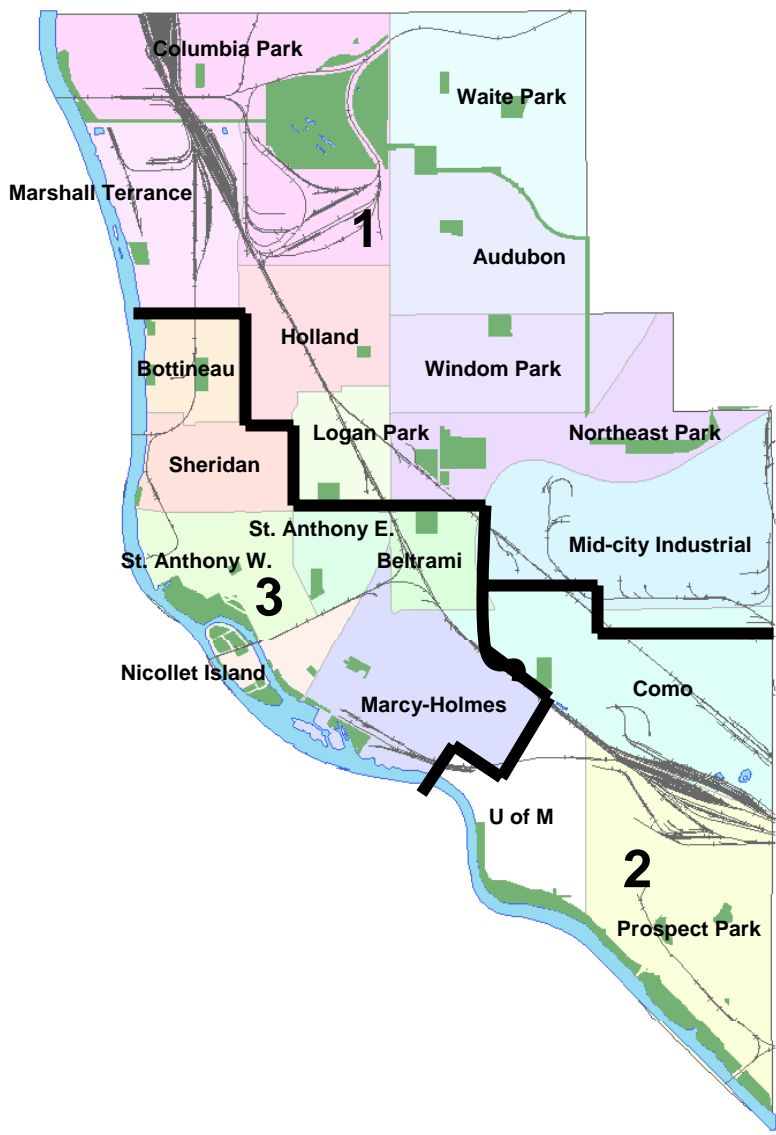
- **Property Crime-** (Burglary, Larceny, Auto Theft, Arson)
  - **Down 7% over 2008**
    - Larceny/Burglary decreased 4% and 5% respectively.
      - 71 fewer Thefts than 2008.
      - 37 fewer Burglaries than 2008.
    - Auto Theft decreased 28% or 111 fewer than 2008.
- **All Crime-** (All Part 1 crime and counted misdemeanors)
  - **Down 10% over 2008**

# The “Bottomline” on Crime

- Though we did not see the reductions we did last year, since 2007 we have seen:
  - **Part 1 Crime decrease 28%**
  - **Violent Crime decrease 31%**
  - **Property Crime decrease 28%**
  - **Overall Crime decrease 26%**

This makes the 2nd Precinct the safest place to live in the City of Minneapolis.

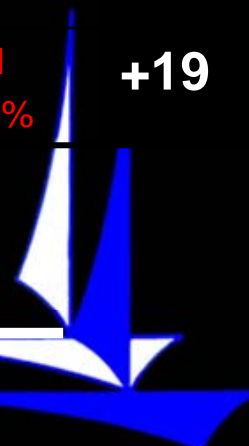

# 1<sup>st</sup> Ward Highlights

- **Top 3 Offenses in Ward 1**
  - Theft
  - Burglary
  - Auto Theft
- Audubon Park, Columbia Park, Marshall Terrace, Waite Park, Windom Park, all saw significant increases in Burglary.
- Holland, Logan Park, Northeast Park all saw decreases in Burglary.
- **Why did Holland, Logan Park, and Northeast Park see decreases in Burglary?**
- **What are they doing that we can learn from?**
  - Holland and Northeast both saw an increase in block clubs.
- **Remember**, Burglary can be prevented by increasing home security and watching out for your neighbors by calling 911 when you see suspicious activity.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward Highlights

- While we experienced the opening of the new TCF Stadium, overall crime decreased in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Ward an average of 25%.
- **Top 3 Offenses**
  - Theft
  - Burglary
  - Auto Theft
- In Como, there were 2 more Part 1 Crimes during the 09 season than in 08.
- There was 1 fewer Part 1 Crime in Como on Game days than 08.
- **Bottomline**, game days were not days we saw increases.
- In Prospect Park, there were 4 less Part 1 Crimes in 09 than in 08.
- There was 1 less Part I Crime in Prospect Park on Game days than 08.
- **Bottomline**, no Part 1 crime increase during the 09 season.
- U of M saw a 12% decrease in Part 1 Crime with this new venue.
- **S.E. Strategic Compliance Team formed to focus on Party Houses.**

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward Highlights

- The 3<sup>rd</sup> Ward saw a significant decrease in crime across the board.
- **Top 3 Offenses**
  - Theft
  - Burglary
  - Auto Theft
- **S.E. Strategic Compliance Team is formed.**
- Increased student outreach by MPD and Student Liaisons.
- **Marcy-Holmes is notable** given it's proximity to the new TCF Stadium.
  - 16% decrease in Part 1 Crime in 09 compared to 08.
  - They experienced 4 more Part 1 Crimes during the 09 season than in 08.
  - They experienced 1 more Part 1 Crime on game days.

# Common Denominators

- Theft
- Burglary
- Auto Theft
  
- Most of these offenses are preventable by have active block clubs and taking some simple precautions to protect your home and vehicles.

## 2nd Pct. Investigative Highlights

- Arrest and charging of statutory career criminal who stole ATM's.
- Handle the Handlers Program-probation intervention on known property crimes offenders before they commit crimes
- Developed Intra-Department alert system to communicate information on citywide suspects who commit crimes across Precinct boundaries.
